

ENVIRONMENTAL AND ENERGY POLICY

Statement of intent

Slaughter and May is a leading international law firm, providing a full and extensive range of legal services to a diverse range of clients. We seek excellence in every aspect of our business and are committed to the protection of the environment, prevention of pollution and continual improvement of our performance to help mitigate the impacts of climate change and identify opportunities where available.

This policy provides a mechanism for environmental and energy management throughout all areas of our London office. It covers environmental aspects which we can control and directly manage, and those we do not control or directly manage but can be reasonably expected to influence. Furthermore, it sets out the framework for the development and implementation of our environmental and energy objectives and targets.

Our policy

We will ensure we meet our compliance obligations and other requirements by implementing best practice procedures where possible and maintaining an accredited ISO14001 and ISO50001 Environmental and Energy Management System. We will consider the environmental, including energy, impact of decisions made in the operation of our business.

- **Energy and Environmental Management Systems** - We will use our Management Systems to measure our environmental performance and ensure legislative compliance. We will set objectives and targets to enable us to assess our progress in reducing waste, energy and water consumption and greenhouse gas emissions. We shall ensure the availability of information and of necessary resources to achieve our objectives and targets.
- **Innovation to improve energy efficiency** - We will continually seek to adopt innovative means of improving our energy performance, whilst ensuring we comply with legislation and other requirements related to energy use, consumption and efficiency. We will explore ways to reduce our energy consumption and to improve efficiency in the use and management of resources. We will monitor and report on our energy use annually and will buy all of our electricity on a green tariff.
- **Commitment to climate action** - We recognise the urgent need to address climate change and are committed to reducing our environmental and energy impacts, including reducing our absolute scope

1, 2 and 3 greenhouse gas emissions by 50% by 2030 and 90% by 2040 from a 2018 baseline. We will report annually on progress.

- **Responsible procurement** - We will review environmental considerations when we source and select products and services and ensure that our suppliers have a commitment to environmental standards. We will seek to influence our suppliers approach to sustainable sourcing and make progressive improvements to reduce the environmental impact of our purchased goods. We will incorporate energy efficiency as a key component for new equipment, major renovations and new design.
- **Waste reduction** - We are committed to minimising waste generation by working with our service partners to minimise single-use items and prioritise reduction, reuse, and recycling wherever possible.
- **Sustainable travel** - We will seek to reduce travel and will support modes of transport or other substitute communication systems that minimise environmental impact.
- **Environmental awareness** - We will promote environmental awareness and responsibility among our employees through information, training and community projects. We will actively participate in external independent environmental bodies and forums and our Environment Committee will work to implement initiatives that will reduce environmental and energy impacts. We will engage with our clients where appropriate to demonstrate our commitment to high environmental standards.

Governance

The Partnership Board is the key strategic decision-making body at the firm and is responsible for the business strategy, including in respect of environmental, energy and climate-related risks and opportunities.

Communication

All staff, clients, contractors and interested parties will have access to this policy via the Slaughter and May website. The policy will be included in the induction of new staff, will be reviewed annually and will guide the work of the firm.

Monitoring and Reporting

This policy, along with associated processes and procedures, will be monitored and regularly reviewed by the Environment Committee to ensure that they remain current and applicable to the firm's activities.
